Message from Mrs Berthoud

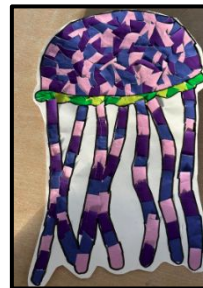
A huge thank you to FOS who have bought some new resources for the children to use on the playground:

Bromley Y - Free Parent Courses starting in January

EPEC, which is supported by the NHS and 'The Centre for Parent and Child Support', runs various parenting support groups, led by parent group leaders, embedded and delivered within local communities. Research and evaluation evidence shows that EPEC programmes improve:

- Parent/carer mental wellbeing
- Parent/carer reflective function and self-efficacy
- Co-parenting/caring relationships, parent/carer conflict, co-parenting satisfaction, and confidence

Empowering Parents, Empowering Communities programmes:

- **Being a Parent Programme:**

Being a parent is an 8-week course for parents aged 2-12 years run by parents, empowering parents to share experiences and learn new skills. The course enables parents to improve communication skills with their children, manage behaviours, family dynamics, and improve parent-child relationships.

- **Parent Group Leader Training:**

Parents also have the opportunity to become Parent group leaders, by building on their existing skills and receive FREE training, to deliver Being a Parent courses to other parents in the borough. Parent group leaders will receive free personal development and support. Ongoing training, support and supervision will be provided, plus out of pocket expenses paid.

These courses begin on Friday 23rd and Wednesday 30th January at Parish Primary School and Community House, Bromley respectively. They run for 8 weeks. Please see the link for details on how to book.
